James L. Bowser enters the Pennsylvania State Bowling Association Hall of Fame for his meritorious service to the game of bowling.

Jim is a life member of the Butler County USBC Association and served as the Association Manager for 20 years. He is a National ABC LAOTC graduate, and served as the Local Association Lane Inspection Coordinator. Jim has been involved in organized bowling for 40 years and has served as a league officer many of those years. He co-hosted a local bowling radio program and even appeared in the movie, Kingpin. He was inducted into the Butler County Bowling Hall of Fame in 2001.

On the state level, Jim served on many of the PSBA committees, including several Ad-Hoc committees and the Scratch Masters Tournament. He was responsible for the upgrading and reprinting of the PSBA 75th Anniversary book, and currently serves as the PSBA Dinner Chairman. Jim served as a PSBA Western Area Director before being elected PSBA 4th Vice-President. He was the PSBA President during the 2003-2004 season and serves on the PSBA Advisory Board.

Jim has bowled in 38 PSBA Tournaments and 18 ABC/USBC National Tournaments. His high average is 205. He won numerous Local Association tournaments and was a member of the State VFW Championship team. He also was a member of the 2005 PSBA Senior Champion team.
