

Vince Mazzanti, Jr enters the Pennsylvania State USBC Hall of Fame for his outstanding achievements in bowling.

Vince has over 75 certified 300 games, and over 40 certified 800 series. His highest league average is 239 and a high series of 868. Vince has been active in organized bowling for over 60 years.

Vince has bowled in 20 PA State USBC Open Championships where he has won numerous championships. On a national level, Vince has been competing in the USBC Open Championships for 27 years and 20 years competing in the USBC Senior Masters Tournament. Vince has an Eagle by his name as the ABC Senior Masters Champion in 2005. In 1973, Vince became a member of the Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) and won numerous titles on the Senior Tour and was named PBA Senior Rookie of the Year in 2002.

Vince holds various Championship titles within the Lower Bucks County Bowling Association and has been on the All-Star Team for 14 years. He was voted Best Bowler of All Time by the Bucks County Courier Times.

Along with Vince's success on the lanes, his service to the game is also outstanding. Vince has been a bowling center owner/manager and a 50-year pro shop owner as well as a certified ball driller.

He was inducted into the South Jersey Men's Bowling Association Hall of Fame in 1984, Neshaminy Sports Hall of Fame and the Lower Bucks County Bowling Association Hall of Fame in 1992.
