PENNSYLVANIA STATE USBC WOMEN'S CHAMPIONSHIPS RULES

1. ELIGIBILITY

- This tournament is certified by the USBC and governed by the rules and regulations of USBC and the PA State USBC.
- Each entrant must be an adult female member of the USBC and of a local Association served by the PA State USBC.
- Appropriate USBC membership must be verified prior to bowling. Participants who are not in possession of a current USBC membership card must purchase an associate membership prior to competing or will be subject to disqualification.
- No more than two participants on a team may be members of a professional bowling organization on or after January 1, and through the date of participation. Likewise, no more than one participant of this fashion may compete on a doubles team.

2. EVENTS

- Tournament will consist of a four (4) person women's team, minor events (doubles and singles) and All Events. Each event is conducted in both Handicap and Scratch Divisions. Bowlers are entered into both divisions automatically. Bowlers competing in the minor events must bowl both doubles and singles.
- No Bowl Senior Singles – Bowlers aged 60 and older as of the opening date of the tournament are eligible to enter only **ONCE** a No Bowl Senior Singles Event, utilizing their **FIRST** three (3) game team score (scratch and handicap). Must enter before first team event is bowled.

3. HANDICAP

- HANDICAP for each event shall be 100% of the difference between entering average and 690 scratch for Singles, 1380 scratch for Doubles, and 2760 scratch for Team. Handicaps will be computed on three game series.

4. AVERAGES

- Entrants shall use their highest USBC previous season's winter league average, 21 games or more. If there is no previous winter league average, entrants shall use their previous highest summer league average, 21 games or more. If there is no previous season winter or summer league average, entrants shall use their current highest USBC league average as of March 1st of 21 games or more. An entrant without a 21-game average as of March 1st shall use their current highest USBC league average for 12 games or more as of April 1st. **ALL OTHERS BOWL SCRATCH (230).**
- If, at the time of bowling, entrant's current average is 10 or more pins higher than the entering average, the higher average must be used (USBC rule 319A-2).
- It shall be each bowler's responsibility to verify the accuracy of their average in this tournament, whether originally submitted by the bowler, team captain or others. Failure to use the proper average or make a correction prior to the completion of the first game of a series shall disqualify their score. USBC rules 319A-3 & 319A-4 applies to all entrants.
- USBC Rule 319C Average Adjustments, & 319D Reporting of Prior Prize Winnings applies to all entrants and must be reported.

5. ENTRY FEES AND ENTRY

- Entry fees in full must accompany each entry filed. Advanced Reservations will be held only until February 1. Entry closing date shall be one hour prior to the final squad. Walk-in entries shall be permitted. Entry fees shall be made payable to the Pennsylvania State USBC. A \$35 service will be charged for all returned checks.
- Entry fees shall not be refunded except when PA State USBC Women's Tournament Director notifies an entrant of dates and times assigned and a refusal has been received by PA State USBC Women's Tournament Director within 15 days of the date of notice. No change will be made to the entrant's scheduled date and time except in case of emergency and must be approved by the Tournament Director.
- Individual overpayments of \$5.00 or less will not be refunded.
- Order of bowling shall be as designated on the entry form. Bowlers should register at least thirty minutes prior to their squad time.

6. MULTIPLE ENTRY

- Bowlers may enter multiple times in team, doubles and singles. No more than two players on the same team can place more than once in the prize list for position standings; no player may cash more than once in doubles with the same partner. A bowler may cash only once in singles, All-Events, and no bowl seniors. In all cases a bowler's first score (including substitutions) in each event shall count toward all events and first score bowled in team for no bowl seniors.
- Multiple participation is allowed; however, bowlers may only bowl with one team, or one doubles set per squad.

7. SUBSTITUTIONS

- Substitute(s) are permitted provided they meet the eligibility requirements. A substitute shall take the place in the lineup of the original entrant.

- 1) A substitute will not be required to reimburse the original entrant with the entry fee paid nor shall the substitute be expected to give the original entrant any prize, money or awards she may have won.
- 2) The captain shall notify the Tournament Director, or her assistant(s) of all substitutions, at least one (1) hour before the scheduled time of bowling.

8. PRIZES AND AWARDS

- PRIZE FEES shall be paid \$100% in cash prizes. Only those entrants who pay the \$10.00 entry fee qualify for participation in the All-Events prize fund but all entrants bowling in the three events qualify for the All-Events Championship Award. Teams and individuals shall be eligible for only one prize in each event, that being the highest prize.
- PRIZE RATIO shall be one prize for each five entries in regular events and one prize for each eight entries in all events and no bowl seniors. MINIMUM PRIZE in any event shall be no less than the prize fee for that event. Allocation of the prize list in each event will be 75% to handicap and 25% to scratch.
- Awards of same type and quality will be awarded to scratch and handicap champions in each event.
- In the event of a tie for first place in any event co-champions shall be declared. Prize monies shall be combined and divided equally.

9. CONDUCT & DRESS CODE

- CONDUCT — if bowler appears intoxicated, uses loud or inappropriate language, or conduct which delays the competition the tournament director will have the right to disqualify and or remove the bowler from the center while tournament is in progress.
- DRESS CODE - Entrants are required to wear suitable attire. Attire that is not suitable – halter tops, bare midriffs, workout attire, spaghetti strap tops, short shorts, short skirts/skorts, any clothing with offensive language/images. Entrants will be required to change if wearing any of the above.

10. OTHER

- No practice on any scheduled tournament lanes for that day.
- Tournament Management shall schedule tournament lanes for each event of this tournament.
- All decisions of the tournament manager/on-site tournament manager are final unless an appeal is made in accordance with USBC Rule 329.
- Entrants in the PA State USBC Women's Championship Tournament do so at their own risk of personal injury. The PA State USBC shall not be liable for loss to personal property or personal injury received by a participant during travel to and from the annual PA State USBC Women's Championship Tournament.
- Failure to comply with the above rules shall result in Disqualification of scores.
